General Speakers List	Is valid and continues throughout the whole debate. ATTENTION: When it runs out, the debate closes automatically and we move into voting procedure!	Always	When the Chair opens the Speaker's List, hold up your placard to be recognized for it
Caucuses	Forms of debate. Require simple majority to pass. Procedural vote.	At any time in the debate, after the appropriate motion has been passed	Motion
a) Moderated Caucus	Formal discussion on a specific topic with a time limit and individual speaking time similar to the GSL. Speeches made must be in accordance with the topic.	"	"
b) Unmoderated Caucus	Informal discussion appropriate for finding allies, building blocks and writing working papers and draft resolutions, also has a time limit.	"	"
Motions	A tool to introduce caucuses, extensions of caucuses and voting procedures, as well as debate suspension, adjournment and closure. Suspension: Debate is postponed Adjournment: Debate is closed and topic discarded Closure: Debate moves into voting procedure for a draft resolution immediately <i>Country XY moves / raises a motion for a moderated caucus of xy minutes, xy minute(s) speaking time on the topic of XY.</i>	At any time in the debate, as long as the Chair opens the floor to motions	



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	<i>Country XY moves / raises a motion for an unmoderated caucus of xy minutes.</i>		
Yields a) ... to another delegate b) ... to the Chair c) ... to questions	In case of remaining speaking time on the GSL, delegates can decide how it shall be used. If delegates wish to let another delegate speak for the duration of the leftover time. If delegates do not wish to use their time. If delegates would like to use the remainder of the time to answer questions by the committee.	At the end of a speech on the GSL only	
Right of Reply	If a delegate's personal or national integrity was attacked and (s)he wishes to reply. ATTENTION: It is only granted at the discretion of the Chair. Delegates must formulate their grievance precisely by sending a note to the Chair.	At any time during the debate	Send a note to the Chair
Points a) Point of Parliamentary Inquiry b) Point of Order c) Point of Personal Privilege	Questions regarding the rules of procedure. Improper parliamentary procedure. Personal discomfort which impairs the ability to participate in the session.	NOT during a speech
