



Rules of Procedure	Description	When	Tool
General Speakers' List= General Debate	during the whole debate. ATTENTION: When it runs out, the debate closes automatically!	Throughout the whole session.	
Caucuses	Forms of debates. Require majority.	At any time during the general debate.	Motion to introduction
a) Moderated Caucus (rule 11)	<i>Time limited formal</i> discussion on a <i>specific topic/ duration/ speaking time</i> .	"	"
b) Unmoderated Caucus (rule 10)	<i>informal</i> discussion to find allies, build blocks, draft resolutions.	"	"
Motions	A tool to introduce Caucuses / voting procedures/ debate suspension, adjournment, closure.	"

Yields (rule 19)	In case of <i>remaining speaking time</i> , the delegate decides upon <u>how</u> it should be used.	At the end of your speech. ONLY during the general debate.	
a) ...To another delegate	To listen to a certain country's position (ally or enemy).		
b) ...To the Chair	If you do not wish to use your time.		
c) ...To questions	If you wish to be asked questions from the committee members		
Right to reply (rule 20)	If a delegate's personal or national integrity was attacked and (s)he wished to reply. ATTENTION: It's granted at the discretion of the Chair. Formulate your wish precisely by sending a note to the Chair.		
Points (rule 21ff)		Not to interrupt speakers!	
a) Point of personal privilege (rule 21)	Personal discomfort which impairs the ability to participate (e.g. can't hear/ cold/ hot).	Can interrupt speakers in extreme cases!	
b) Point of order (rule 22)	Improper parliamentary procedure.		
c) Point of parliamentary inquirement (rule 23)	Questions regarding the rules of procedure, addressing the Chair.		

adjournment of the meeting= to close the topic never talk about it again.
suspension= to postpone debate e.g. to next week.
closure= automatically means to go into voting procedure on the draft.
