

We are standing up for the vulnerable!

Acknowledging that the climate is changing rapidly,

Acknowledging the Paris Agreement of 2015 and its climate goals,

Recognizing the need for additional research and scientific studies into all sources and causes of climate change,

Driving attentions to coastal regions that are directly affected by the rising sea level,

Convinced that changes in climate have an impact on development,

Encouraging the international community to build up a platform providing expertise to countries that are actively asking for guidance for transformation toward renewable energy,

1. Calls for support to fight against climate change without hindering the growth of less industrialized nations in particular:
 - a. investments in 'green technologies' and 'green energy',
 - b. transfer of knowledge and technologies between developing countries to share cost effective ways to defend themselves and against the effects of climate change,
 - c. transfer of knowledge and technologies between developing and industrialized countries,
 - d. abolish import taxes on renewable energy sources,
 - e. foster climate change awareness programs on all levels;
2. Urges the international community to take measures that help the weaker affected countries to deal with the consequences of climate change by but not limited to:
 - a. ensuring food security that is in danger due to flooding and droughts,
 - b. ensuring water security that is in danger due to melting glaciers and droughts,
 - c. ensuring protection from increasing natural disasters;
3. Endorses the creation of a global fund in order to support vulnerable countries in protecting themselves and recovering from the effects of climate change including the following conditions:
 - a. In order to finance the fund, countries wishing to combat climate change and turning our only world green should donate at least 2% of their GDP,
 - b. the countries that commit themselves to financing the global fund for combating climate change are binded by the declaration,
 - c. the collected funds will be used as monetary compensations for standing forests to incentivize forest conservation and monetary incentives for replacing and postponing the construction of coal-powered power plants,

4. Calls for a carbon neutral world economy by 2090,
5. Encourages the establishment of a wind research facility situated in Switzerland concentrating on improving renewable energy technology,
6. Demands that Qatar, Canada and Russia produce 55% of renewable energy by 2030, starting with 10% by 2022. Saudi Arabia will produce 30% of their energy as renewable energy by 2030.
